deStilte

De Stilte is a professional dance company that focusses entirely on developing and producing performances for children. Under Jack Timmerman's artistic direction De Stilte creates multi-layered performances featuring academically trained dancers. Since its foundation in 1994, the company danced over 2.800 performances for 370.000 visitors in 20 different countries.

Education is an integrated part of De Stilte's method of working. Presided by the artistic director, an educational team of four sets out policy plans for primary education, secondary education and the company's amateur department. De Stilte works with a group of fifteen dance teachers to put policy into practice.

When at play, a child discovers the world around him. Through imitation and imagination he learns to be part of a community whilst also touching base with its own inner being. In that process, body language is a child's first means of communication. The playing child dances.

De Stilte aims to stimulate self-awareness in children without explanation. Incite children to create stories of their own.

Boundless stories of the imagination. Every step from imitation to imagination means a leap forward towards the great unknown. In a world that is changing rapidly, it is necessary that each child's creative capacities are addressed. For children who do not play will never learn.

Blue or pink, the distinction is already there at birth. What would the world look like if we would not care about this? Boys and girls are equal. That goes without saying. But what happens when we show this? Will the distinction disappear if we sent boys to ballet and girls to soccer?

Goys and Birls is a colourful dance performance that elevates the beauty of movement beyond that of either man or woman. Dance can be tough, charming, aggressive, hopeful, mysterious, energetic, emotional. Goys and Birls fights the cultural laws and patterns, in an attempt to eliminate the differences.

Flying Cow

Whether a child plays by itself or with others, in the game of play reality gets a face. *Flying Cow* is an adaptation of the success performance *MADCAP*.

In MADCAP three female dancers challenged each other in a game of equals. In Flying Cow, the inclusion of a male dancer proves sufficient to witness two girls compete for the favours of a boy. Just like a giant gap can arise through a small crack, a minor change is enough to turn the entire plot upside down. What was thought to be a small adjustment at first, got an entirely different undertone during the rehearsal process that no one could have foreseen. Flying Cow, the struggle of two girls over one boy.

A very reluctant Mr. Pickwick finds himself transported into the world of a child. Removed from the familiarity of the grown-up world, he finds himself caught up in an adventure in which the normality of everyday life becomes mysterious, and a strange little girl a playmate. Little by little, he grows to realise that the riches of this children's world are a far greater possession than the seriousness of the existence to which he is usually accustomed. Two dancers present us with a surrealistic, magical world in which humour and amazement add lustre to life.



1-2's are dance duets on location, performed on a mobile floor of 3,50 x 3,50 metres. Sitting around the dance floor, the audience witnesses from up close the confrontation that unfolds between two dancers. In a short time frame of ten minutes, they are introduced to dance. In the workshop that follows the audience gets to experience first hand what dance entails, with cooperation and trust as the underlying themes.

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
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
